The Executive Diploma in Shipping and Maritime Business is a specialized higher education program for managers designed to address today's challenges and tomorrow's opportunities in the maritime industry – with a special focus on Finland and the Baltic Sea.

- Gain a holistic understanding of shipping and maritime business.
- Join a dynamic peer group of industry professionals from diverse roles and backgrounds and academic subject experts.
- Build a skillset to meet the evolving demands of one of the world's most vital industries.
- Strengthen your career mobility: from off-shore to onshore, or from adjacent professions into the maritime cluster.

This diploma is not just about learning
– it's about creating a **platform for business development, innovation, and networking** in close collaboration with industry stakeholders.



Programme Structure

- Duration: 1.5 years (part-time)
- Extent: min. 25 ECTS (EQF 7 / Master's level),
 1 cr = 25-27 working hours
- Format: Modular, designed for experienced professionals
- Implementation language: English
- Compulsory attendance:
 - » 6 intensive on-site sessions (2–3 days each), morning (9-12 a.m.) and afternoon sessions (1-4 p.m.), 1 h lunch break
 - » 3 online sessions (2 days each), morning and afternoon sessions (as above), 1 hour lunch break
- Online activities, individual and group tasks between sessions
- Continuous guidance from mentors and lecturers
- Follow-up discussions to assess the impact and applicability of course learning in participants' professional careers
- Capstone project in collaboration with industry partners

Core Components

- Shipping Essentials (5 ECTS)
- Microcredentials (min. 10 ECTS, tailored selection from 12 topical areas)
- Capstone Project (5–10 ECTS, group-based)
- Elective Studies (min. 5 ECTS)

Shipping Essentials,

an introductory course (SEMESTER 1)

- Ship management and operations in context (actors and agents, daily operations (commercial, operational, technical), staffing, role of traditions)
- Shipping market (actors, market dynamics, role in global trade, and historical development)
- Shipping business in supply chains (customers, logistics companies, stevedores, ports, agents, shipping companies, ship management companies, the classification societies etc.)
- 4. Maritime regulation and legislation (law of the sea, IMO, EU, states, companies, and contracts –how do they interact?)
- Sustainability (economical, environmental, technological and social perspectives)
- Future challenges and opportunities (digitalization, data, business logics etc.)
